Dear Colleagues,

As the inaugural Editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of the Professoriate*, I invite you to submit a manuscript for publication consideration. The *Journal of the Professoriate*, an official publication of the Brothers of the Academy Institute (BOTA), is an international, refereed, and scholarly journal that seeks to promote lively discourse among scholars and policymakers on various issues affecting college and university faculty in higher education in America and abroad. The primary mission of the *Journal of the Professoriate* is to provide an outlet for critical analysis and scholarship on issues pertaining to the pathways leading to the professoriate as well as all issues about and relevant to college and university faculty within academe and the global society. The *Journal of the Professoriate* is interdisciplinary in design and seeks to offer a rich mixture of empirical research (quantitative and qualitative methodologies) as well as theoretical discussions.

The *Journal of the Professoriate* will address many of, but not limited to, the following issues and topics: (a) the impact of faculty on student development (e.g., recruitment, retention, academic achievement, and life-long learning); (b) the role, experiences, and outcomes of faculty at two-year and four-year colleges and other postsecondary settings; (c) diversity issues that impact college faculty; (d) organizational, leadership, and legal issues impacting college faculty; (e) issues pertaining to the utilization of technology by college and university faculty; (f) issues concerning faculty unionization, interactions between faculty and other university personnel, collective bargaining, academic freedom, adjunct faculty, instructional staff, and other special faculty appointments; and (g) comparative studies of faculty in America and abroad.

I hereby send a general and open call for all empirical manuscripts (quantitative or qualitative) that identify issues and theories, critically discuss concerns and interests, and/or systematically analyze data pertaining to college and university faculty in the United States as well as in other countries.

Two issues will be published each year by Stylus Publishing starting in the Spring of 2006.
